

***“For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it?” Luke 14.28***

Dear Friends,

This is a verse I think our ancestors must have been contemplating when they planned for the Christ Church Rectory. They did well! For the house was built two hundred years ago this year, and it is still proudly standing at 329 Sycamore Avenue, where it has housed our clergy for many generations.

After all these years, the house is still beautiful; I have loved living there for the past twenty-eight years! It is full of character and sometimes the walls themselves do seem to be speaking, sharing secrets of the past with us today.

That said, there is much work that needs to be done. In 2022 we kicked off a Rectory Campaign to address the much-needed maintenance and updating to the house. The house is a HUGE asset for the church. Think about it: without it, how would our parish ever be able to afford to house a priest and his/her family in this area of Monmouth County? I’m not sure it could be done! And of course, the close location of the Rectory means I never miss out on anything happening at the church; it is a brief five-minute walk, no matter what the weather.

For Phase One of the Rectory Campaign, parishioners pledged close to \$110,000. We have received quite a bit of that already. And we are now beginning the work, which I would like to tell you about.

In a few days, Prawn’s Windows and Doors, a local company that has been in business for many years, will be arriving at the Rectory to begin the task of replacing 26 windows and the three doors that lead into the house. This will immediately give us savings, as currently the curtains blow whenever the wind comes along. Steve Porowski, who has done a lot of work for us over the past years, is constructing custom covers for the radiators downstairs (the upstairs will perhaps be done a bit later). We converted to gas heat a few years ago, and this will save us the costly expense of completely removing the radiators.

In early June, the painters will arrive and begin work on the downstairs; then they will tackle upstairs. In addition to painting, they will do much-needed repairs to the walls. The last time the interior of the Rectory was painted was in 1997 (with the exception of me sprucing up my children’s bedrooms from time to time). You can imagine how much the place needs a fresh coat of paint!

This is not all: the twelve-year-old water heater recently bit the dust and will be replaced shortly (no more cold showers!). The basement sump pump, which is no longer working, will also be replaced.

These are the goings-on for the next few weeks. But that does not mean the work is done. We continue to *sit down, estimate the costs*, and care for this beautiful house that God has entrusted to us, just as our predecessors did. We cherish the fact that what they did two hundred years ago is still a wonderful, functioning asset for us. It is the intention of your vestry (and priest!) to make sure we have a Rectory that will continue to serve our parish for many more generations to come. We can do that because of the generosity of the people of Christ Church.

Keep tuned! I hope to host several events at the Rectory this summer and fall so that every single member of our congregation has an opportunity to come take a look at the Rectory. It is, after all, your home too.



## YOUTH SUNDAY





- Sunday at 10:15 am (inside the church)


The two services are unique and different, and we hope you find one that suits your own summer schedule.

## PEAK IN THE WEEK MAY 2025



The usual practice of Peak in the Week is to take a summer break from the end of May until the beginning of September. With that in mind, the book chosen for May is meant to expand over the summer months when Peak is "breaking". The book is *Sitting at the Feet of Rabbi Jesus*, written by Ann Spangler and Lois Tverberg.

Spangler and Tverberg take a close look at various Jewish traditions and, sitting at the feet of their Rabbi Jesus, they explain and explore how those traditions worked. Understanding how they worked "way back when" can shed light on how we can deepen our understanding and worship of our Rabbi. We will begin talking about the book in May and then continue individually to read, maybe a chapter a week, over the summer months. The expressed goal of the authors of *Sitting at the Feet of Rabbi Jesus* is to show How the Jewishness of Jesus Can Transform Your Faith. The current edition of the book contains a study guide which can be helpful in getting the most out of the book. The book can be a very meaningful resource for all of us as we strive to find more authentic and meaningful ways of worship. See YOU in September!


