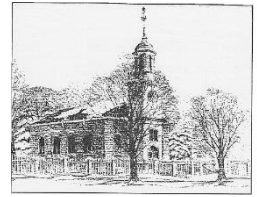

REVOLUTION 249!

Dear Parishioners,

For the past few years, we have gathered with our Presbyterian neighbors on the Sunday before the Fourth of July to celebrate our nation's Independence Day. As you may (or may not) know, Independence Day is marked on our Liturgical Calendar as a day of worship and remembrance. While we usually hear about the separation of church and state, the truth of the matter is that they can never be fully separate; we are citizens of both heaven and earth, and we have are responsible for doing whatever we can to be the best citizens we can be of both worlds. On this day, we strive to bring the two together in harmony!

This year we are meeting on Sunday, June 29 at 10:00 am at the Parish Hall at the Presbyterian Church. Christ Church will once again provide the delicious fried chicken and parishioners from both churches will bring side dishes. Every year we have had a marvelous speaker from the community: local historian Rick Geffkin, former mayor and chair of the Shrewsbury Historical Society Don Burden, and DAR member Joanne Slocum, who has been doing a lot of research and work in both of our graveyards surrounding the Revolutionary War.

This year, we are doing something a bit different. We will still be having worship (inside again, by popular demand) and will have communion together. But instead of a sermon or lecture, we are going to be discussing ideas appropriate this time around: for next year is the 250th anniversary of the Revolution, and we want to be ready!

Monmouth County is already laying out a whole calendar of plans for 2026; Nancy Stewart and Connie Goddard recently went to a planning meeting and shared all kinds of information with the Vestry. In another week or so, the town of Shrewsbury will also have a meeting and Pastor Katja and I plan to attend, seeing what events we might be able to collaborate with or piggyback on. We are both on the same page on this: we want to see what our two congregations can do to help celebrate our congregations' own historical parts in the founding of this country.

We are both looking forward to exploring ways we can partner together. We have been neighbors for a very long time, it is exciting to think about joining up to make a real impact in our community. Our history is unique and wonderful, and one "tool in our toolbox" to draw people into our church, and into our faith.

Please mark your calendar! I suggest you park either on the street or in our Christ Church parking lot and walk down to the Presbyterian Church. If you can come early, I am sure the Presbyterians could use a little help getting things set up and putting the food out. And come ready to discuss whatever ideas you may have.

This is a wonderful way to kick off your Fourth of July Holiday. I hope to see you there!
