

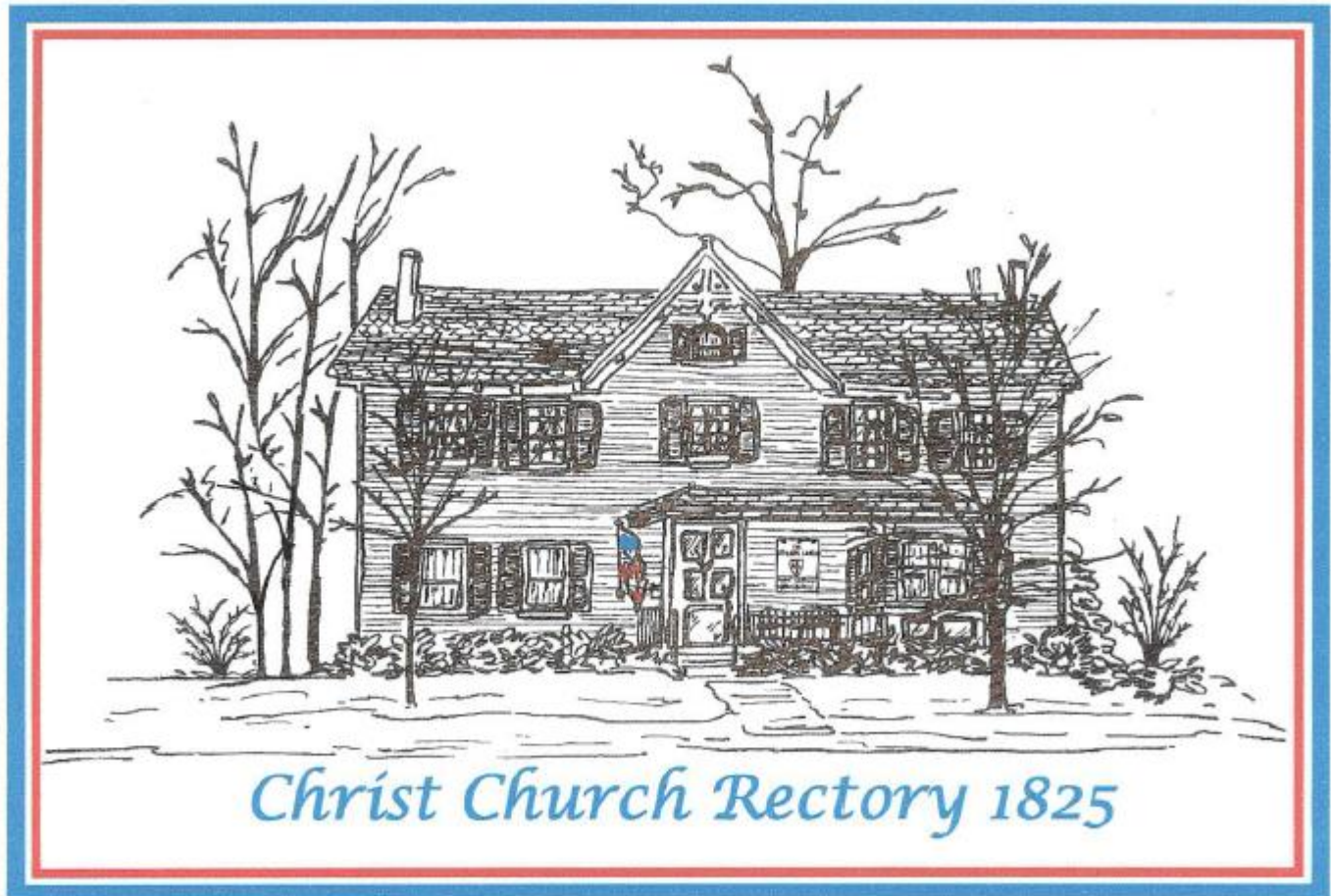

PRAISE

Dear Parishioners,

Wonder, Love, and this month it is PRAISE! Praise is how we express our gratitude to God for each and every day on this beautiful green earth and give thanks for being included in the family of God through our baptism in Christ Jesus. While I hope that every single one of us pauses at some moment during the day to give a little shout out to God, we also make a special effort to join together at least once a week so that we can praise God altogether. Young and old, we make a joyful noise to the Lord and join our hearts and spirits as if we have one voice.

How meaningful it is when someone stops to say thank you or to acknowledge our part in their lives; it is no different with God. Which is why of PRAISE. How could we not long to gather together with our Lord?

I am particularly glad for this to be the month of PRAISE, because we have a lot going on in that department. As you have read in our weekly emails and heard in church, the Vestry voted to move our principal service to 9:00 am starting September 7. What prompted the change? A couple of things, the primary one being that our organist/choirmaster Fiona Sutherland was ready to turn in her resignation at Christ Church because she had a change in her fulltime work schedule and would not be able to continue with us.

When I informed the Wardens and Vestry, they immediately saw this as an opportunity. An opportunity for us to worship together in one service. An advantage to our families with school-aged children is that they are better to manage their busy Sunday schedules, not having to choose between church and other activities. It also makes it more cost-effective when I am away, as it is easier to secure a supply priest and the cost is less for one service.

Of course, a change in service time will pose a challenge to some. We are hoping to address that as well as we can. We are considering adding another service, similar in style to the former 8:00 said mass, if needed. It was a topic of discussion at our last Vestry Meeting, and the consensus was that an additional service at 11:00 am would be the best time. If at least a dozen parishioners let me know that they would attend this service, we will try it out. This is not a final decision – it is a starting point. You will find more information about this at the bottom of this letter.

We have another fun worship event planned: the Annual Parish Picnic. This year it will be held at the Christ Church Rectory on Sunday, September 14 at 11:00. Look for details in this Crown. We will be using a version of The Gathering service used at both of our Open Houses this past month.

Speaking of The Gathering: how exciting is it that we are starting a brand-new opportunity for worship? This is unlike anything else we have going: a prayer service directed to adults with intellectual disabilities. This new ministry will begin next month. You will be hearing much more about this in the months to come.

Wonder, Love, and PRAISE. Each intertwined, each a part of who we are and what we do. I am so delighted that we are in all of this together. Praise the Lord and Amen!

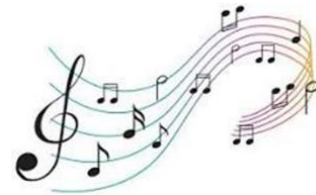
Upper Church School (grades 7 and up) will meet in the turquoise classroom after church service for approximately 30 minutes. So, please grab your snacks then head down to class.

The Gathering held its first open houses in August, and they were very well received! The parishioners who attended expressed their enthusiasm for what they experienced and are now strong supporters of the ministry. We also welcomed attendees from the ARC of Monmouth, including a staff member and a resident from a local group home, as well as guests from as far away as Gloucester County. The resident from the group home was particularly enthusiastic about The Gathering and mentioned that she would like to attend again. When I later spoke with Deacon Magdalena, who works at the group home, she shared that the resident talked excitedly about the event all afternoon. We plan to hold additional open houses for The Gathering in October, and we hope you will attend and help spread the word about this wonderful ministry, which serves a historically underserved population.

Please help yourself to the brochures and give them to anyone with a connection to special education. Could you post them at your job, your gym, your grocery store, anywhere where people will see them? I truly believe that for every person, there are at most six degrees of separation between themselves and someone with special education needs. That they are related to a person who is disabled or know someone who has a family member who is disabled. Maybe they or someone in their family works in special education, or they know somebody who does. Help spread the word about this fantastic ministry and thank you for your support.
