



Dear Friends,

For nearly thirty years I have spent almost every day surrounded by a graveyard. That may not be considered the healthiest way to live one's life, but I have grown rather accustomed to it: I love looking out my office window across not just our graveyard, but the Presbyterian graveyard as well, to find the presence of so many who have gone here before me. So many beautiful stones and markers, containing mere hints of who is buried beneath. So many histories waiting to be discovered. It fills me with wonder.

Stop and consider the wondrous works of God. One does not have to look far to appreciate the wonders that infiltrate our lives. You may not be looking out onto graves, but I imagine you see all kinds of things out your own window. Birds, squirrels, butterflies and bees, each with their own stories. Cars rolling along, walkers and runners, too. Don't you wonder? What is their story? Where are they going? What brings them joy or sorrow?

I am a bit sad to say goodbye to the warm, sunny days of summer, but at the same time I am eagerly anticipating all the beauty that autumn in New Jersey brings. ECW: EPISCOPAL CHURCH WOMEN



DID YOU KNOW THE DAUGHTERS OF THE KING ARE PART OF CHRIST CHURCH?

We are proud of Tia LaPiana, who was inducted into The Order of The Daughters of The King this past August. While competing her six-month discernment program, she worked to fulfill her dream of establishing "The Gathering". All the Daughters support her and wish her well on this endeavor. Tia had the idea to make ribbon book markers for all the Books of Common Prayer and for the Hymnals.

Christ Church has two long time Daughters from 2012, Perky Cameron and Judi Buncher, who is the Treasurer of the Diocese of New Jersey Daughters of the King.

The Order is for women and girls who desire a closer walk with God. It is a sisterhood bonded together by a Rule of Life, living out vows to pray and serve Christ every day as part of our regular lives. Its membership is more than 20,000, mostly in the United States, however it is rapidly grown internationally in over twenty countries across the globe.


The Order is open to adult women members of the Anglican, Episcopal, Lutheran, and Roman Catholic churches. They meet regularly in small group Chapters usually in their own church or a sister church. Daughters take lifelong vows of prayer and service. We serve the Church in ways agreed upon by the membership in consultation with the clergy. We always wear a special cross which is the emblem of The Order. It is a modified Greek Fleury cross inscribed in Latin, "Magnanimiter Crucem Sustine" which means "With heart, mind and spirit uphold and bear the cross". It is my hope that Christ Church will have their own Chapter in the future. If anyone would like more information regarding this, please contact me with a text message at 7321-861-0249. I have so much joy to tell you about the Order and how it has enriched my life!

Junior Daughters are baptized girls and young women of any Christian denomination aged seven to twenty-one who make a promise or pledge of daily prayer and service. The Junior chapter is led by a Junior Directress who is a Senior Daughter. Their chapter is often made up of girls of different ages, different schools and even different Christian denominations who all make the same promise of prayer and service to our Lord Jesus Christ and wear a Junior Cross.

One upcoming event of the Daughters of the King events is a Quiet Day at St. Peter's Church in Freehold on November 1st. All women are invited. Join us as we Explore the Creative Life of Prayer with The Rev. Canon Susanna Cates. Hope to see you there.






BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS: THE FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS
