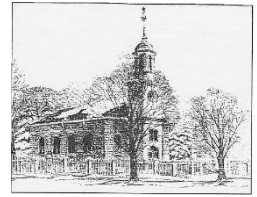

Dear Friends,

Things are quickly winding down for me. Well, not the final wind down - I hope that is years down the road. But at least for my wonderful time here at Christ Church. There have been so many “lasts” these past weeks. My last All Saints Day, last singing of the Great Litany in Procession, last Christmas Bazaar, last Blessing of the Stockings, and last Christmas services.

Soon it will be my last baptism, my last Epiphany Pageant, my last Vestry Meeting, my last Annual Meeting. You may be thinking that I won’t miss such things as Vestry Meetings, but surprise of surprises, I really will miss them: you have terrific leaders here at Christ Church who are dedicated to working faithfully for our common goals. Our work is done with laughter and joy and a sense of trust in one another.

When I arrived here in the summer of 1997, I would never have dreamed that I would spend so many years in one place. I am glad that I have. This is true of both priest and parishioners. In other words, if we don’t know each other by now – we never will!

I think we do know each other, and I think we appreciate what this community of faith has come to mean to us. For me, the words of Paul to the Thessalonians seem right on target. I give them just a little tweak: *So deeply do I care for you that I have been determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also my own self, because you have become very dear to me.*

When I started out on this journey, I never dreamed I could become so attached to a parish church. I guess that is exactly what happens if one stays around long enough. I have been there when your children were born and baptized, seen those children grow up and have even stayed long enough for your children to have children themselves. I have had the privilege of presiding at the final services for countless numbers of our very own saints, and I cherish the memory of each one.

And you have done the same for me. You welcomed my young family as your own and watched my children grow up among you. You were there for me when my marriage disintegrated and I was so in need of friendship, love, and support. You held me in prayer when my mother was dying, and I was so very far from home. And you were there with Jeff and me at our wedding (finally, at long last!) celebrating as if you were a very part of my family. And so you are.

You have become very dear to me. I will carry the memories I have of this place and of each of you wherever I go. And I suspect that those memories will anchor me and encourage me when the way is difficult and the future unknown.

I don’t know what is in store for me, or for you. But I trust that whatever it is, it will be just right. Just what our Lord has in mind for us all. Please remember me in your prayers, as I will remember you. You forever hold a special place in my heart.

These pledges total: \$109,125	

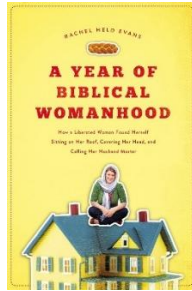

HOLIDAY BAZAAR WAS A SUCCESS!

The 2025 Christ Church Holiday Bazaar, held on Saturday December 6 was a HUGE success for our church! The addition of five outside merchants selling a variety of items along with not one but TWO Santa Claus's roaming the street helped pull in more foot traffic along with a massive promotional campaign on social media that was spearheaded by Kristen Downs.

This year also saw the return of the kitchen – with simple lunch options of hot dogs or vegan chili – that proved to be quite popular and helped keep the Parish Hall buzzing with activity. Other new additions included a kid's craft (free of charge) which ran all day in one of the classrooms, pictures with Santa and a standalone 50/50 raffle. We raffled off 36 beautiful baskets, sold delicious treats in our Bake Shop and continued the tradition of Trinkets & Treasures. Total revenue for this year's event amounted to over **\$6800** – which far surpassed last year's total of \$3862.

This year we once again offered tiered ticket pricing for the baskets (based on the overall basket value) to help maximize our revenue. Tier One consisted of 17 baskets worth up to \$83 in value; a sheet of 25 tickets cost \$40 for this tier. Tier Two had 19 baskets worth \$85 or more with a sheet of 25 tickets costing \$50.

I truly believe the increase we saw in attendance and revenue is in very large part due to the ideas and actions of Kristen Downs and Lisa Marino, both of whom joined the Bazaar team for the first time this year. Lisa and Kristen came in with fresh ideas, tons of energy and the willingness to help in any way to grow our Bazaar – and boy does it show in our numbers!

Thanks to Elaine Feyereisen and Nancy Stewart for managing and staffing the Bake Shop; Bramley Maber and Jeff Veil for staffing the kitchen the ENTIRE day; Laura Stroebe for running the kids craft room so patiently; Marie Maber for running the homemade goods and jewelry table; Lynn, Mimi and Sarah for handling the ticket selling all day and Josie for selling the 50/50 tickets!

Thanks to all of you who contributed -- by donating baskets; helping decorate; attending the bazaar;

sponsoring the kitchen; giving monetary donations for baskets or baking goodies for our Bake Shop!! It simply cannot happen without each and every one of you and the part(s) you played.

Extra special thanks to Sue Nap – who's vision manages to bring it all together turning the Parish House into a Winter Wonderland. To Walter, who makes so much of the physical stuff happen and puts together the Trinkets & Treasures section all with a smile. And last, but certainly not least, Judy Buncher whose ability to stage ANY basket is what makes our event look so amazing!
